Our project stone, "Barion Oval/Quake 311" was cut by: Connie - Tourmaline, Howard - Lavendar CZ, Thom - Blue CZ. Other stones: Doc - 2 Pidgeon Blood Agates that he cut some years ago and provided an insight into Federation judging, Dale - Herkimer Diamond (last month's project), Howard - Yellow/Green CZ (beautiful) and Connie - Orthoclase.

Dale gave a program on how to optimize cutting angles to fit the material being cut. He used our competition diagrams as examples and provided graphs and data showing how to determine what angles to use based on what you want to see from your cut stone.

Next meeting is Sept. 23rd and our project stone is "Tripsy", a different Trillion design.

The Facetors also met in June and July and had some great stones. In June, Howard stated that he uses "super lube" with 8000 diamond paste on his ceramic lap to do the final pointing before polishing. This helps to avoid over-cutting facets, as the 8000 is slow to cut. We're always in need of useful tips coming from our cutting experiences.

In July, Connie brought an untreated lolite crystal, when treated it is considered Tanzanite. The crystal was sizable for Tanzanite and displayed colors of gray, blue and a dark smoke. Dale brought diagrams for our 2018 competition. A Novice design and an Advanced design. Both will prove to test our cutting skills, so we need to start right away. Dale will do the judging of the stones again this year.

September Birthstone



Sapphire has been popular since the Middle Ages. Blue sapphires range from very light to very dark greenish or violet blue, as well as various shades of pure blue. Sapphire is a variety of the gem species corundum which is an aluminum oxide (Al2O3). Corundum has a regular crystalline structure formed by repeating patterns of arrangement in a trigonal crystal system. They are strong stones, 9 on the Mohs Scale.

Sapphires are found in both igneous and metamorphic rock. When sapphires are rooted in solid rock, they are considered primary deposits. However, sapphires are frequently found some distance from their original source. The process of erosion moves rock fragments into streams where they

are fractured, releasing any gems they contain which from their weight travel downstream in rivers and become secondary or alluvial deposits. Alluvial gem gravel is the most lucrative source of sapphires because it contains concentrated amounts of gemstones that are relatively easy to extract.

Although you could go to Africa, Asia or Australia to find sapphires, they can be found throughout Montana. The majority of the finds can be attributed to four major locales: Yogo Gulch, Rock Creek, Dry Cottonwood Creek, and the gravel bars along the Missouri River northeast of Helena. Montana's Largest, Oldest and Funnest Sapphire Mine is Gem Mountain. Plan a summer field trip between May and September.
