Then, July 16-20 many of us set up an info booth at the Mesa County Fair and told people about our club. You would be impressed and amazed at what a good job our volunteers did there. I was.

Sadly, one of our club members and instructors, **Cindy Teare**, passed away on July 13th. She has been a member since 2015. Cindy will be missed.

On **Aug 3rd** from 9 am-12 am or so, come to the clubhouse, and practice your mineral identification skills. We will help Austin McChesney get organized for the Silent Auction at our fall rock show.

The board is concerned about the number of bodies in the shop at any one time. JSRC June/July 2024 News

Hope everyone has been enjoying their summer. Hard to imagine school starting up again in just a few weeks. JSRC is getting back to the business of learning about rocks. **The next JSRC meeting will be held on August 6th at 5 pm. Geodes will be the focus of the presentation.**

Saturday, June 8th, Steve Cable led a field trip to Floy Wash. We had a good time in the desert with Steve collecting fossils and agate. JSRC did not meet in July. Bev was out of town and without a coleader there wasn't coverage.

GJGMC Annual Gem and Mineral Show

September features the GJGMC Annual Gem and Mineral Show. This will be the 78th year the club has held this event. It features 40 vendors, a Kids Korner, a Silent Auction, and exhibits of gems and minerals. **We will again be encouraging members and their parents to sign up to work (two-hour slots) in Kids Korner. By volunteering, families receive free entrance into the show for the day they work.** We will be sponsoring a Bingo game for kids, Spin the Wheel, and will be helping Whitney with Grab Bags. Hours for the show are 9 am - 5 pm on Saturday and 10 - 4 pm on Sunday. Many members have their volunteer sheets working towards 20 hours of volunteer time for earning the volunteer badge. (We will have additional forms for our new members.) We will begin the sign-up sheet for the 2-hour time slots at our August meeting.

Member Rock Collection Exhibits

Last year we had four members who created great rock displays for the show. They generated a lot of interest and were very popular with the public. Want to learn where to find wood, fossils, or agate in Utah? There's a great website with a different article every month, on some aspect of rocks, especially around Moab! There was a nice feature on petrified wood around Moab, but here is a link to all the past articles: https://www.moabhappenings.com/Archives/000archiveindex.htm#geology – you can also pick up a hard copy of "Moab Happenings" around town.

In the story on petrified wood, we learn that knowing a little geology tells you where to look for petrified wood. The author notes that "Near Moab, petrified wood can be found in several rock layers (*formations*), with the Chinle and Morrison formations being most likely to contain petrified wood. Both these units were deposited in terrestrial environments, usually by rivers in their channels and on their floodplains. Many of these floodplains were forested, or at least dotted by trees." Of course, you would find more petrified wood if you looked in rocks that had been in swamps or streams or forests – not in sand dunes or the bottom of an ocean! So it's helpful to know how different rock layers formed.

So how do you know where to find "Chinle and Morrison" formations? Around here, we can recognize Chinle because it makes up the brick-red slopes below the Wingate cliffs in the Monument. It's mostly made of mudstones and siltstones from ancient rivers. It has some of the best-known petrified wood in Utah. We recognize the Morrison formation as the one that makes up Dinosaur Hill and has been the source of many dinosaur fossil finds. It has the "candy-stripe" hills of red, gray, and white layers. The author of these articles, Allyson Mathis, points out that the beautiful colors in some petrified wood come from dissolved iron oxides, manganese, sometimes uranium, and other minerals. Petrified wood forms when wood is buried in sediment, and then solutions containing dissolved minerals percolate through the wood. The wood is replaced by the minerals – mostly silica (agate, opal, quartz) but with colors depending on what else is dissolved in the fluids.

The author reminds us that "All fossils on federal public lands are protected by the Paleontological Resources Protection Act because they provide important insights into past life. The Bureau of Land Management allows the collection of 25 pounds of petrified wood plus one piece per person per day for personal use with a maximum of 250 pounds per year, except in national monuments and other areas where collecting is prohibited."

Check out Allyson's articles for everything related to geology and rocks, from earthquakes to the rocks that make hanging gardens, to rocks in all the different national parks in Utah!
