Junior Science Rock Club News

JSRC September 2024 News

The next JSRC meeting will be held October 1st at 5 pm at the Club House at 2328 Monument Road. Fossils will be the unit this month with Melissa Moroni presenting. Members are encouraged to bring the results of their geode experiments to share with everyone. (Someone please take pictures for the website)

A big **thank you** to the families who volunteered at Kid's Korner over the weekend for the **78th Gem and Mineral Show.** It's an anxious time preparing for this event but it is always so enjoyable interacting with visitors. Who knew spinning a bicycle wheel could be so fun?! Gem trees were again the stars of the wheel. Additionally, we revived the Rock Box activity and were pleased with the response from visitors. For the low price of \$5, visitors got to choose 12 specimens with labels from 22 options to begin or add to their rock collections. Thank you to all the adult collectors who provided specimens for this activity. 300 bingo cards were distributed in the vendor Geode Bingo Blackout game. **(Kids remember to use your volunteer form to record your hours towards your volunteer pin.)**

September's meeting focused on geodes and how they are formed. After watching a video about how geodes are created and all the different types, everyone created an environment to grow crystals using eggshells as the "vug". This unit dovetailed with the bingo blackout event for the rock show featuring famous geodes from around the world. Members bagged mini geodes from Kentucky with a label and then picked one to add to their own collection. A big **thank you to JoAnn Piburn** for opening the shop and cutting geodes for anyone wanting to see what was inside. Participants at the rock show completing their bingo cards got to choose a mini geode from this same collection. (A big **thank you to Jeff and Summer** at the geode booth for cutting geodes for visitors playing bingo blackout.)



Want to learn how gemstones like emeralds and sapphires form, and where to find them? If you like to listen to podcasts while you drive, here's a great site with dozens of cool rock and gem-related podcasts: https://www.geologybites.com/lee-groat

In this particular one, we learn from a Canadian geologist about places where he has found beautiful emeralds, sapphires, and bright blue spinels. The sapphires were discovered by two Nunavut brothers on Baffin Island and later made into a 48-sapphire brooch for Queen Elizabeth's Jubilee celebration. Canadian professor Lee Groat and colleagues studied the rocks where the sapphires were found. They concluded that they formed in a marble-like rock and that it took a specific "recipe" of temperatures and pressures over history to make the sapphires. Specifically, three separate events produced the sapphires: first, the parent minerals were formed, but then they were altered, and finally a chemical reaction resulted in corundum – which is what sapphire is. Now the scientists think they can tell where else to look for these gems. The scientists say that the geology where they are found is similar to that of Kashmir and Myanmar, world-famous for their gems.

Dr. Groat has also found nice emeralds in the Yukon and Ontario. Emerald is a type of Beryl (which also includes aquamarine). Colombia had been thought to be the prime source of emeralds, but in 2010, some were found in Canada. It takes another specific "recipe" of fluids, minerals, pressures and temperatures to form these emeralds.

He has also found beautiful blue spinels on Baffin Island, and peridots – now being found by using drones.

They also study the red beryl deposits in Utah – another unique set of conditions that produced the beryl. The presence of all these gems tells geologists the history of the specific area – whether there was a collision between ocean and continental plates, mountain-building episodes, faults, or volcanism.
