Lee Cassin has kindly provided some items to auction at upcoming club meetings. The first box will be auctioned at the Nov 14th club meeting. Theresa Pytell will bring the box of items for your inspection before that meeting starts.

Theresa says the items to be auctioned at the Nov 14^{th} meeting include:

A smith torch with two tips. The small tip is extra and is hard to come by. The 2-stage regulator, hose, and tips. New is a \$265 value plus a small tip.

Approximately 2.5 ounces of fine silver bezel. Scrap value: \$78 which would be way more than that from Rio Grande.

Texturing hammer - \$15 New value

2 bezel pushers - \$5 new value

The whole box would be approximately \$363 new! Proceeds from auctioning this box would go towards scholarships for CMU students.

Smithsonite – a beautiful blue mineral worth collecting!



Smithsonite, named after the person who originally funded the Smithsonian Institution, has a botryoidal appearance (looking like bubbles), sometimes with radiating needles. New Mexico is famous for its Smithsonite. It's a zinc carbonate – zinc being the 4th most common metal mined, after iron, aluminum, and copper. You have probably heard of galvanized cans, the zinc used as a coating to keep the metal from rusting. It's used in car bodies, bridges, sunscreen (zinc ointment), and ointments (calamine lotion). It also makes up almost all of today's pennies, which have

only a thin coating of copper. But in mining zinc, sadly, many beautiful specimens of Smithsonite went into smelters!

Pure Smithsonite is clear, but it usually has small amounts of different impurities, which give it many colors, but the blue-green, above, is the most sought-after. It forms when hot waters full of dissolved minerals form other zinc compounds, which are converted into Smithsonite by fluids circulating through those ores.



This specimen is from Mexico from the famous Santa Eulalia District.

Besides the beautiful specimens, Smithsonite is also used by lapidary artists to make spheres, carvings, and cabochons. If you ever get a chance to go to the New Mexico Bureau of Geology Mineral Museum in Socorro, just south of Albuquerque, NM, they have gorgeous specimens! Many are from the famous Kelly Mine in the Magdalena District in Socorro County, NM. Admission is free and for info, you can call (575) 835-5490 or go to geoinfo.nmt.edu/museum/ for more information.
