The Evolution of Fossilization





WANT A FUN PLACE TO VISIT IN OCTOBER? TRY UTAH'S DEVILS SLIDE

Located in Weber Canyon, near the border of Croydon in Morgan County, off I-84, the slide has been written about in Utah's history since the 1840's. Two parallel limestone strata protrude from the surrounding hill some 40 feet high. The distance between the two sides is roughly 25 feet.


Viewing areas are available on the sides of the highway and the Weber River is between the highway and the slide

From a fun history standpoint the slide was discovered in the 1840's by workers on the transcontinental railroad with references from a man named John Walker. They called the slide by the name "Gutter Defile".

There are several legends about the slide. One says that when God threw Satan out of heaven, he slid down to hell on Devil's Slide.

Another fun legend states that Catholic father Pietro del Torra was travelling through the canyon and encountered the Devil disguised as a Spaniard who tempted him. Not succumbing to temptation, Father Torra prayed while holding up his crucifix and weakened the Devil. The Devil fell down the side of the mountain which caused the slide to form.
