Geologic Hazards We Don't Think About

Rocks are not interesting just because of their beauty. Colorado's Geological Survey notes a "range of Colorado's geological hazards, including avalanches, falling rocks, landslides, mudslides (debris flows), swelling soils, sink holes, mine subsidence, and flooding". Our Grand Junction area has to deal with several of these – rocks falling on our highways, swelling soils that can damage homes, of course, flash floods... But one was catastrophic – The 2014 West Salt Creek Landslide that claimed the lives of three local men.

Just southeast of Collbran, it was the longest landslide in Colorado's historical record. The geology that caused the landslide has been extensively studied by local Colorado Mesa University geology professors, especially Dr. Rex Cole, whose specialty is Grand Mesa's geology. Professors Verner Johnson, Andres Aslan, and the Grand Junction's Gem and Mineral Club's own Dr. Bill Hood, provided key research on the area. And CMU's David Wolny provided seismometer data that showed exactly when the first precursor events started happening. Just before the May landslide, a very heavy snow had fallen and right before the event, a heavy rainstorm occurred. But it took the geology to make the landslide happen.

Grand Mesa is made of a hard basalt cap with very weak rock layers underneath it. There is a layer of gravel called the Goodenough Formation, and below that Green River Formation shales. (The same formation as the one on Douglas Pass with the nice leaf fossils). And under that is a mudstone/sandstone formation called the Wasatch. When these lower layers became water-saturated, a block of rock that was a remnant of an earlier slide, tilted back into the hillside and the rocks below slid out, causing the whole hillside to collapse.

Scientists studying the landslide estimated that the volume of rock that moved was about 17 MILLION cubic vards and the 2mile-long slide accumulated in a matter of minutes, traveling at up to 80 miles per hour. It is hard to say whether the area above the slide will be stable in the short term. The area below and around the slide is full of active gas wells, but the state and county have monitored the area in the hope of detecting any future problems before they happen. One of the main programs of the Colorado Geological Survey and CMU geology department is studying the local geology to understand hazards and how they can be avoided.
