GJGMC Shop Expansion Election Results

At our General Meeting on Thursday, Feb 27th, 2025, Bruce Johnson gave us a good presentation about the Shop Expansion Project, aka the Jewelry Studio.

After some discussion, we asked the club members to vote on several questions. We had 75 people who signed in, and 5 people who did not sign in, for a total of 80 votes. Then 4 volunteers counted the votes. On some questions, they counted 1-3 votes differently. All questions were decided by margins of over 30 votes, so those differences were not significant. I have recounted the ballots myself, and I attribute the differences to the ballots sticking together. You can count them too if you want.

Question 1. Should the furnace be replaced as part of the lapidary shop upgrade? Estimated cost \$4,650.

During the discussion period, Austin volunteered to investigate alternatives that might save money. One way or the other, we plan to replace that furnace.

Question 2. Are you in favor of building a new jewelry studio?

Therefore, the club is overwhelmingly in favor of building the jewelry studio. It was not unanimous. The people who voted No have legitimate concerns that we can respect. Nevertheless, we will go forward with this project.

The remaining questions were counted for the 72 people who were in favor of it.

Question 3. Vote for only one of the following three items:

A) New Jewelry Studio - \$34,500 15' x 23' ID, sink only

1 vote

B) New jewelry studio - \$36,105 15' x 27' ID, sink only

54 votes

C) New jewelry studio - \$38,305 15' x 27' ID, ADA Bathroom

17 votes

Therefore we will plan to build the 27' long studio, without the ADA bathroom.

Question 4. Accept Polaris Surveying's proposal for a Site Survey -costing \$1,900 and authorize the project manager/president to proceed.

Question 5. Should future annual budgets include a portion of membership fees to help pay back studio construction costs?

Later in the meeting, Michael Daniels presented the Annual budgets to the club, both the Operating Budget and the Capex Budget. The members approved those unanimously by acclimation with none objecting.

The History of Lapidary

There was a time (thousands of years, actually!) when we did not have Genies, grinding wheels, tumblers, faceting machines, flat laps, Vibralaps, and all the other machines we couldn't do without today!

But people, as long as we have been human, have been attracted to beautiful rocks and shapes and enjoyed decorating themselves with them. The first jewelry we have evidence of used existing materials, but with holes drilled in the stones, wood, or shells to wear. Often the small stones would be hand-rubbed against harder rocks to smooth the edges – something that must have taken quite some time!

Early examples we know of are from the Middle East, India, Africa, Europe, and elsewhere. Turquoise, amazonite, apatite, lapis, and Carnelian were collected in huge trade networks. Early lapidarists had an excellent understanding of the properties of the rocks they used. They were able to use chert points, hand sawing, and heat treatment to hand drill holes and shape stones. But even through the 1800s, people sometimes used a setup as simple as a glass plate with grit on it, or sandpaper of decreasing

grit size, to polish rocks. This was done by hand and was a slow process, as illustrated in an old RocknGem magazine!



Then versions of grinding machines came into use. Sometimes a hand crank turned a wheel which the stone was held against. Or a foot-pedal-turned wheel was used. Wood-spool cabbing machines were some of the earlier ones.

Now there is no end to the nice machines you can buy. But if you want to give no-machine lapidary a try, there are complete instructions here for making cabs using just sandpaper. (It takes a while!)
